E-commerce: E-commerce (electronic commerce) is the buying and selling of goods and services, or the transmitting of funds or data, over an electronic network such as the internet.

Clickjacking: When someone is deceived into clicking on one element on a webpage instead of their intended target. The attacker exploits this by using the victim's click for malicious purposes, such as activating their webcam, installing malware, or gaining access to online accounts.
